Eligibility and Definition of Classes

The ability level at which dogs compete at this show depends entirely on the ability level of the dog and does not depend on the level of the handler or the owner, subject to the following conditions, where KC = Kennel Club.

Please note that dogs can be entered at one ability level only. Dogs over 18 months that have not competed before may enter at either Beginners or Elementary level - but not both

Beginners: Open to all dogs, over 15 months, **that have never entered a K.C Show** – choose your jump height. – jump heights at 25cm(9.8”) (micro), 35cm (13.75”) (small) or 45cm (17.7”) (medium). Full jump height option not available for these classes

Veterans: Open to all dogs aged 8 years and over – choose your jump height. Choose your jump height in accordance with ability level of your dog – jump heights at 25cm(9.8”) (micro), 35cm (13.75”) (small) or 45cm (17.7”) (medium). Full jump height option not available for these classes

Anysize: For dogs age over 18 months **not entered in any other class** and for whatever reason are not able to jump at their designated jump height – choose your jump height – jump heights at 25cm(9.8”) (micro), 35cm (13.75”) (small) or 45cm (17.7”) (medium). Full jump height option not available for these classes

Elementary: Open to all dogs over 18 months, that currently compete at KC Grades 1 or 2 or equivalent.

Novice: Open to all dogs that currently compete at KC Grades 3 or 4 or equivalent.

Advanced: Open to all dogs that currently compete at KC Grades 5, 6 or 7 or equivalent.

Dogs entered in Elementary, Novice or Advanced classes may be entered as Large, Medium, or Small depending on the following definitions:

Large Dog: For dogs that measure over 430mm (17”) at the withers. FHO jumps will be set at 65cm (25.6”), LHO Lower Height option) jumps will be set at 55cm (21.6”)

Medium Dog: For dogs that measure over 350mm (13.75”) and measuring 430mm (17”) or under at the withers. Jumps will be set at 45cm (17.7”).

Small Dog: For dogs that measure 350mm (13.75”) or under at the withers. Jumps will be set at 35cm (13.75”)

ABL (Anything but Large) Classes: Combined medium and small classes for dogs that measure 43cm (17”) or under at the withers

Trophies & Rosettes

Trophies will be awarded to the winners of each class

Rosettes will be awarded to 4th place, or 20% of class, whichever is greater

Rosettes for the Beginners classes will be to 6th place

Clear round rosettes and Judge's Special rosettes are available for all classes.

The organisers reserve the right to withdraw any class where the entry is deemed to be insufficient

Warm-up ring available from 7.30am to 09.30am, £1.00 per minute, pay on the day.

Marking of Classes

Beginners/Veterans/Anysize classes will be judged over the same course – but will be marked separately and will have separate awards for each class, unless it is a combined class.

Classes will be marked according to standard KennelClub rules with the following exceptions:

- 🐾 Up contacts will not be marked.
- 🐾 None of the following will be used in any course: well, wall, table.
- 🐾 A silent toy may be carried in the ring during competition in Beginners' classes only. The dog may not touch the toy once it has started its round and the toy must not be given to the dog until the handler and dog have left the ring. Food and squeaky toys are not permitted in the ring at any time.
- 🐾 In Beginners/Veterans/Anysize Classes the A-frame, dog walk and seesaw (where used) will be low level – there will be no weaves.
- 🐾 All rings will be surrounded by netting.

Fun Classes

Power & Speed: The course is in two parts – an agility contacts course and a jumping course.

Each competitor will first complete the contacts course with their dog. This course is not timed – if any faults are incurred, then they are eliminated from the class and **DO NOT** get the opportunity to complete the jumping course.

If no faults are incurred, then they are allowed to complete the jumping course, which is timed. Both time and any faults incurred will be recorded for the jumping course – scoring will be marked according to standard KennelClub rules as per 'Marking of Classes' shown above.

Class 20 is a combined class for anysize and Veterans

Class 21 & 22 are combined classes Grades 1-7

Pay on the Day Classes

Clear Round:

Complete an agility course within the generous time limit to obtain a clear round rosette. You may enter as many times as you wish. Cost £2:00

Hoopers Challenge

Hoopers is an obstacle course involving tunnels, barrels and as the name suggests, **HOOPS**. It is set out so that it allows the dogs to run freely and naturally and is low impact. This makes it particularly suitable for puppies, older dogs and dogs recovering from injury. Any size or breed of dog can do it!

Guess your own time!

Time permitting. This class will be announced over the PA system if there is sufficient time left to run it. Apologies if we run out of time!

Complete the course set out. But **BEFORE** you start, you have to guess how long it will take you and your dog to complete it! If you knock a pole off, you must go back and put your dog between the poles – if you fail to complete any other obstacle, you must return to that obstacle and complete it correctly. Faults are not recorded – the handler/dog completing in the time nearest to their guesstimate is the winner.

SHOW RULES

1. All dogs should be over the age of 15 months on the day of the show and should be suitably trained for the event in which entered, which is entered at your own risk. Dogs under the age of 15 months on the day of the show are not eligible to compete.
2. Entry fees as shown on entry form.
3. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse any entry.
4. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
5. No bitch in season is allowed within the precincts of the Show.
6. A dog shall be withdrawn from the Show if it is:
 - 🐾 A bitch which is in season
 - 🐾 Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease or has been exposed to any such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the date of the Show
 - 🐾 Interfering with the safety, or the chance of winning, of another competitor
 - 🐾 Of such a temperament or is so out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
 - 🐾 Likely to cause unnecessary suffering to the dog if it continues competing
7. No person shall carry out punitive or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the precincts of the Show.
8. Should a Judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another Judge.
9. No competitor shall impugn the decision of any Judge.
10. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order. The latest time up to which they will be able to compete will be at the Judge's discretion.
11. Should circumstances so dictate the Committee may, in consultation with the Judges, alter any arrangements as considered necessary.
12. No animal other than the one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the Show during its continuance, except dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Committee.
13. All dogs are entered at the owners' risk and whilst taking every care the Committee cannot be held responsible for any damage, loss or injury caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the Show.
14. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
15. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
16. Separate entry forms must be completed by each competitor and must be signed by the competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon.
17. The Committee reserves to itself the right to defray any costs from the entry fees if the event has to be cancelled or abandoned.
18. Entry fees will not be refunded beyond the closing date of the show.
19. **Other than when engaged in warm up ring**, no practice will be allowed before, during or after the Show and no dogs will be allowed into the ring at any time other than when being judged.
20. A silent toy may be carried in the ring during competition in the Beginners' classes only. The dog may not touch the toy once it has started its round and the toy must not be given to the dog until the dog and competitor have both left the ring.
21. In all matters concerning the competition, the Judges' decision will be final. In all other matters the decision of the Show organizers will be final.
22. Acceptance of the show rules is deemed to be a condition of entry to the show.

GENERAL INFORMATION

DIRECTIONS: SAT NAV – Barr Street, Huddersfield, HD1 6PB

From the North: Follow the M1 South to the M62 and take the westbound route towards Manchester.
Leave the M62 at Junction 25 and take A644 towards Huddersfield/Mirfield.
Follow A644 for half a mile then take second exit off RAB onto A62 towards Huddersfield.
Follow A62 for two and a half miles and Barr Street is on your right (at 3rd set of traffic lights after Syngenta site, which is on your left))

From the East and West: Approach Huddersfield via the M62.
Leave the M62 at Junction 25 and take A644 towards Huddersfield/Mirfield.
Follow A644 for half a mile then take second exit off RAB onto A62 towards Huddersfield.
Follow A62 for two and a half miles and Barr Street is on your right (at 3rd set of traffic lights after Syngenta site, which is on your left))

From the South: Follow the M1 North to the M62 and take the westbound route towards Manchester.
Leave the M62 at Junction 25 and take A644 towards Huddersfield/Mirfield.
Follow A644 for half a mile then take second exit off RAB onto A62 towards Huddersfield.
Follow A62 for two and a half miles and Barr Street is on your right (at 3rd set of traffic lights after Syngenta site, which is on your left))

I appreciate the routes suggested may not be the shortest, but they are generally the most trouble-free and avoid Huddersfield Town Centre for those who are not familiar with the area.
